What is Assistive Technology?




Assistive technology (AT) is any item, piece of equipment, or product system, whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of people with disabilities.





People with disabilities use AT devices and services to achieve greater independence and to enhance the quality of their lives. AT includes both devices and services.

AT services are supports provided to people with disabilities or their caregivers to help them select, acquire, or use AT devices. Services also include functional evaluations, training on or demonstration of devices, and purchasing or leasing devices.
