### Supporting Narrative By JTALLENT, 02/19/19 13:21

#### Narrative

On 2/19/19 at approximately 1153 hours I was dispatched to the Colonel Glenn Youth Home located at 20400 Colonel Glenn Road to investigate a report of a medical issue. Upon arrival I observed MEMS unit 334 loading a female patient for transport. I spoke with MEMS staff and was advised that the females name is [REDACTED] and that she had taken an unknown amount of Ny-Quil this am and was feeling the effects by becoming drowsy. I then made contact with the Colonel Glenn Youth Home nurse, Morgan Jerry and she stated that MEMS had been called due to the fact that [REDACTED] was lethargic. Contact was then made with [REDACTED] mother, Kimberly Chattmes, and she was advised that [REDACTED] was being transported to Arkansas Children's Hospital for observation due to not known how much Ny-Quil was actually taken. While speaking with [REDACTED] she was able to answer my questions and admitted that she had taken an unknown amount of Ny-Quil. [REDACTED] stated that she did not have a measuring cup so she just took a mouth full and got ready for school. The Colonel Glenn Youth Home staff was provided the incident number.
