Supporting Narrative By CROBBINS, 03/28/19 16:29

Narrative

On Thursday, March 28, 2019, at approximately 1514 hours, I was dispatched to an attempted suicide located at 20400 Colonel Glenn Road, Little Rock, AR. Upon arrival I observed a [REDACTED] (subject of report), a 14 year old minor female, receiving emergency medical treatment by a Ms. Kara Brooks and a Ms. Valerie Alvarez. Both Ms. Brooks and Ms. Alvarez are Registered Nurses on the staff of the Youth Home, Inc. [REDACTED] was being treated for cuts she made to her left wrist in an attempt to commit suicide. Youth Home staff informed me that [REDACTED] obtained a blade from a pencil sharpener in which she used to cut her left wrist. The area around [REDACTED] contained a significant amount of blood on the floor. I requested the PCSO dispatch to request MEMS to expedite their arrival. Rescue personnel with the West Pulaski Volunteer Fire Department arrived and assisted in providing medical treatment to [REDACTED]. MEMS unit #517 arrived shortly thereafter and assessed [REDACTED] injury and prepared her for transport to the Arkansas Children's Hospital. I spoke with a Ms. Rachel Stone and a Ms. Lakenya Ridgell who were both in the immediate area near [REDACTED] when she cut her left wrist. Both Ms. Stone and Ms. Ridgell are on the staff of the Youth Home and informed me that [REDACTED] became upset over receiving threats from other young females who are under the care of the Youth Home. The threat made by the other young females was, "we will jump you." MEMS unit #517 departed the area transporting [REDACTED] to the Arkansas Children's Hospital without incident.
