Narrative

On 4-8-2019 at approximately 1016 hours, I was dispatched to 20400 Colonel Glenn Road in reference to a 16 Y/O who overdosed on an unknown amount of medication. Upon my arrival, I made contact with Allyson Shoptaw (Therapist). Allyson advised me that, sometime between 1000 and 1020 hours, [REDACTED] got a bottle of ibuprofen and swallowed the pills inside. Allyson estimated that [REDACTED] took 30 pills. Allyson advised that [REDACTED] did not say anything about wanting to harm herself but she had been expressing suicidal tendencies for the past week. Allyson advised that [REDACTED] suffers from severe depression and PTSD. Allyson advised that [REDACTED] told a nurse after she took the pills. I attempted to speak with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] would not answer any questions and became very nervous. I was advised by Allyson that [REDACTED] does not do well talking with males because of some past history. The female staff attempted to ask [REDACTED] the same questions and [REDACTED] only stated it seemed like the thing to do. The room was cleared of as many males as possible until MEMS arrival. MEMS arrived on scene and took [REDACTED] to Arkansas Childrens Hospital for further treatment.
