Suicide Attempt

On 8/6/2019, at approximately 1659 hours, I responded to 20400 Colonel Glenn Road in reference to a suicide attempt.

Upon my arrival I made contact with Anthony Nask. Nask stated he is a Behavioral Health Professional for the Colonel Glenn Youth Home. While making his rounds he approached [REDACTED] room and noticed she was lying on the floor inside the closet. Nask stated [REDACTED] was unconscious with a shoe string tied around her neck. Nask stated he cut the shoe string from [REDACTED] neck and called 911. Nask stated a few minutes later [REDACTED] regained consciousness. Nask stated after [REDACTED] sat up he noticed a possible suicide letter in the floor reading, "I'm sorry, thanks for trying Mr. Anthony." I asked Nask if [REDACTED] has a past history of suicidal attempts and he stated, "She does."

I made contact with [REDACTED]. When asked why she was trying to harm herself, [REDACTED] stated, "I have been dealing with a lot and I'm tired of it." I asked [REDACTED] if there was anything I could help with, but she refused to disclose any further information. While talking with [REDACTED] I could observe a red line around her neck, but did not observe any other visible injuries.

MEMS # 229 arrived and assessed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was transported by ambulance to Arkansas Children's Hospital for further assessment. Youth home staff made contact with Judy Cotton ([REDACTED] grandmother) and informed her of the incident.
