Case Narrative**

On 08/29/19, David Daniel (01/18/78) contacted the Fayetteville Police Department to report a Steelman Pro security key was stolen today. He advised D and A Roadside Assistance was called out to Piney Ridge on Crossover Road in Fayetteville. He stated his driver, Greg, went to the call and found an individual needed specialty nuts removed from his flat tire, nuts which he did not have the key for. D and A had a specialty lug key, Steelman brand, and was able to remove the nuts. Greg, the driver, sat the key down and returned to his truck for a moment. When he returned the key was gone. He asked the suspect, the unknown male who made the call of the flat tire, what happened to the key. The male stated he did not know. Due to this, Greg had to use a pair of plyers to tighten the new tire on with. He stated the individual began filming him and asked if it was safe. He replied that it should not be driven a long distance and that he was not able to tighten the tire properly due to the security key going missing suddenly somehow.

When asked for the suspect's identity, Daniel replied it was a cash payment and he did not have the customer's information. He stated the individual then went against Greg's advisement and drove the vehicle to Springdale. He stated the individual called his company from Tire Tracks in Springdale and stated the tire was wobbling and he would take him to court and he had done this sort of thing before. Daniel stated he believed the subject stole his tool and was possible attempting to extort him by purposefully taking the tool, and go against the recommendation not to drive the vehicle a long distance until the tire could be properly tightened. He was advised of the report number and to contact the Fayetteville Police Department if he had more information on the suspect.
