Terroristic Threatening 1st Degree

On 10/29/19 at approximately 1141 hours I was dispatched to the Youth Home INC. located at 20400 Colonel Glenn Road to investigate a report of a student threatening to blow up the school.

Upon arrival I was met by staff member Renita Parker and she stated that student [redacted] got upset and stated that he hated the Youth Home and was going to blow it up. Renita stated that [redacted] continued stating that he had the means to carry out his threat by using a grenade.

April Taylor stated that [redacted] had been sent to her due to being pulled out of class for making the comment that he was going to blow up the school. April stated that once [redacted] was in the D Zone isolation area he continued making threats to blow the school up because of how much he hated the place.

April stated that [redacted] stated that by doing so he would be doing everyone a favor. [redacted] continued by telling April that he knew where to get grenades from and mention the military surplus store.

April stated that she told [redacted] that they would not sell those type of items to him. April stated that [redacted] responded by saying "Who said I was going to buy them".

Monique Summons, Syretta Dodson, Larry Jenkins and Stephen Webb stated that they heard the same comments from [redacted] that April had heard.

Anthony White stated [redacted] was in the decompression room (D-Zone) and he asked him why he was there. After [redacted] responded that he had made comments about blowing up the school Anthony asked him if he would blow up other places just because he got made. Anthony stated that [redacted] stated that he would, and he knows where to get live grenades.

[redacted], arrived at the Youth Home and I spoke with her in regards to the incident. I informed [redacted] that I had spoken with Pulaski County Juvenile intake officer Roger Rasico and was provided a court date.

I explained the terroristic threatening statute and how serious it was to make such threats.

has slight Autism that affects him when he get mad or upset.

At that point staff members brought _____ into the conference room where both myself and _____ were sitting.

I asked _____ what had gotten upset over on todays date. _____ stated that he was up set over the issue of not being able to wear a hoodie.

When asked what he said to be pulled out of class _____ stated that he had threatened to blow the school up along with all of the stuff in it.

I then advised him that he could not make threats like that due to the laws.

I provided _____ with a copy of the Arrest Disposition Report indicating the November 25, 2019 court date at 0930 hours in Pulaski County Juvenile Court.

I then had all witnesses complete written statement that was placed into the PCSO property room as evidence.

Youth Home INC staff advised that _____ was being suspended from school until Monday November 4, 2019.

I provided Renita Parker with the incident number.
