Terroristic Threat

On 11/7/19, at approximately 1153 hours, I made phone contact with Cheyenne Daugherty in reference to a terroristic threat made by a student at the Colonel Glenn Youth Home.

Daugherty stated she was informed by a teacher (Ashley Pankey), a day student by the name arrived to school today in a bad mood and very angry. Daugherty stated she was told that arrived to class and informed the class, "I hope everyone in the room dies a slow and painful death." then stated, "I will bring a grenade to school and blow everyone up."

I made contact with the teacher Ashley Pankey. Pankey stated when arrived in class, he was upset and angry. Pankey stated proceeded to get into a verbal argument with another student named Pankey stated both students were then removed from the classroom. Pankey stated while waling and out of the classroom, told the class, "I hope everyone dies a slow and painful death." then stated, "I will bring a grenade to school and blow everyone up." Pankey stated while walking down the hall, proceeded to tell he would kill him.

I made contact with Laura Robertson with Juvenile Intake and informed her of the situation. Laura advised to document the incident and have file a civil complaint for the threat from
