CRIMINAL MISCHIEF

On Thursday, 10/15/2020 at approximately 1819hrs, I responded to the Colonel Glenn Youth Home in reference to a disturbance.

Upon arrival, I met with Kraig Butler, therapist to the juvenile suspect, [redacted]. Mr. Butler stated [redacted] had been upset about his post staff status, as he saw it as a punishment. [redacted] lost his temper and began destroying a portion of a wooden privacy fence, slamming it against the side of the house, damaging the fascia, and tore apart a wooden picnic table. The total approximate damage was \$280 for the picnic table, \$450 for the fencing, and \$250 for the house fascia.

Mr. Butler stated after [redacted] stopped the destruction, he seemed to calm down a bit, and then said he was ready to go inside. [redacted] also said he wanted to call his lawyer, as he didn't want to stay at this facility any longer. When I arrived on scene, [redacted] was calm and sitting in the break room of the main office.

I asked Mr. Butler what he wanted to see happen with [redacted], and he stated he would prefer [redacted] went somewhere else. I contacted the on call number for Juvenile Intake and spoke with Laura Robertson. After giving Ms. Robertson all the information, she informed me they would not keep [redacted] and would likely cite him out, even if it was to the level of a felony.

I then spoke with [redacted] was very forthcoming with me about his anger previously, admitted to damaging the property, and said he did it because he didn't want to hurt anyone else. [redacted] said he was calm now and wanted to be placed somewhere else. I discussed with [redacted] that his case worker and lawyer would be working on that, but it wouldn't happen immediately; [redacted] said he understood. [redacted] also told me that he would be able to stay calm and follow the rules until alternate housing could be determined by DHS.

I then spoke with Mr. Butler again and asked if he wanted to press charges for the criminal mischief. Mr. Butler stated he would like to "sleep on it" and see how is these next couple days before making that decision. I provided Mr. Butler with this case number and told him to contact PCSO when he reaches a decision.

Four witness statements were completed and have been scanned into this report.
