## Primary Narrative By Alexander Wallace, 12/04/20 18:23

### Aggravated Assault

On December 4, 2020, at approximately 1443hrs, I, Deputy Alex Wallace, responded to the Colonel Glenn Youth Home at 20400 Colonel Glenn Road in reference to a disturbance with weapons.

Upon arrival, we were directed to the Sturgis House where numerous people were standing around the perimeter of the main room awaiting our arrival. Staff members pointed to the corner room where a [redacted] wearing an orange shirt was holding two pieces of wood in the air. One was a large piece of wood with nails sticking out of it, and the other was a smaller piece of wood that appeared to have been sharpened to a point. When we walked in, the [redacted] later identified as [redacted] lifted the larger piece of wood with nails, in a manner which appeared as though [redacted] was going to throw it at deputies. Numerous orders were given to [redacted] to drop the pieces of wood, all verbal commands were ignored and [redacted] continued to look as though [redacted] was going to attack deputies with the objects. Deputies then drew their tasers and issued more commands to drop the objects. [redacted] threw the larger piece, hitting Deputy Vick in the leg. [redacted] then held the smaller, sharper piece to [redacted] neck, and retreated further into the room, making it harder for deputies to see what [redacted] was doing.

After multiple verbal commands, [redacted] dropped the sharp piece of wood and backed to the wall, crossing [redacted] arms. I entered the room to place [redacted] in handcuffs, while Deputy Vick held [redacted] at taser point. [redacted] struggled and resisted my efforts to place [redacted] in handcuffs. It wasn't until several more verbal commands were given that [redacted] relaxed slightly, so I could get [redacted] arms behind [redacted] back and get [redacted] into handcuffs.

While walking through the main room, lunged toward a staff member in a threatening manner. While walking towards the exit, I felt a tug on my service weapon. I looked down and observed hand on my weapon, attempting to un-holster it. I removed hand from my weapon and Deputy Vick and I assisted toward the ground and onto knees in order to distance from it. was assisted back to feet and escorted to my patrol vehicle, searched, and placed into the back.

Statements were obtained from staff members as to what transpired. Those members were as follows: Peyton Woodruff, Caitlin Henthorne, Anthony Mask, and Ethan Brass. Their written statements were uploaded to the report and placed into evidence.

All staff members stated was upset because they took candy away from because of statements made about getting drunk due to putting hand sanitizer on the sucker. When didn't get any more candy, became violent. threatened to kill staff members with sharpened pencils and threw various objects at them. These items include, but are not limited to, bottles, pencils, and pieces of a broken dresser. At one point in rage, began breaking a dresser in room. then used pieces of the broken dresser as weapons against staff.

struck Ethan Brass on the shoulder with a piece of the dresser; Peyton Woodruff and Caitlin Henthorne with a lotion bottle and a handful of colored pencils; Anthony Mask was struck with the piece of wood with nails on arm.

Once was secured in the back of my patrol car, Deputy Vick contacted Roger Rasico with Juvenile Intake. Mr. Rasico was apprised of the current charges and stated would notify staff that we were bringing to their facility.

All proper paperwork was completed at the Pulaski County Sheriff's Office Southwest Sub-station before transporting to the Juvenile Detention Facility.
