Battery / Criminal Mischief

On April 29, 2021 I arrived at the Youth Home Inc., located at 20400 Col. Glenn Road, to investigate a criminal mischief and battery complaint. I met with an employee by the name of Stephen Webb that advised me that a student by the name of got into a disagreement and altercation with another student. At the end of the altercation, jumped on the hood of another employee's vehicle (Tyteonia Morgan), and began hitting the front glass.

Webb advised me he attempted to pull away from the vehicle. Webb stated he grabbed hold of punched him in the face an unknown number of times. I took photographs of Webb, but saw no injuries. I then spoke with another employee (Daniel Watson), and he advised me that he responded to assist Webb, and he observed strike Webb five times. Webb and Watson were able to use a control maneuver, as they put it, to escort to Building Four. Upon getting to Building Four, was still struggling, and another employee (Ben Malone) intervened to assist in placing on the ground. During this process, bit Malone on the top side of his left hand. I took photographs of that minor injury.

I spoke with owner of the vehicle, another employee by the name of Tyteonia Morgan. Morgan advised she did not see any damages, but I could see a slight crease on the hood of the vehicle. I estimate the value to fix the crease at less than \$50.00. Photographs were taken of the vehicle.

I met with to check his welfare, and get his side of the event. was calm at the time, and admitted to all that happened. had one scratch on each arm, and I photographed them. stated the scratches occurred as result of staff trying to control him.

All photographs were submitted to evidence, and all victims were advised of warrant process through juvenile court.
