BATTERY 2ND DEG

On Friday, 6/4/2021 I responded to the Colonel Glenn Youth Home located at 20400 Colonel Glenn Road in reference to a disturbance.

Upon arrival I made contact with staff at the entrance of the Sturgis House. I was advised that [redacted] had been causing a disturbance in the house, had slapped one staff member, and had expelled a full fire extinguisher inside the home. In the process of expelling the fire extinguisher, [redacted] sprayed four staff members.

The victims, Peyton Woodruff (Lead Clinical Therapist), Christian Spratt (Qualified Behavioral Health Professional, QBHP), Rodney Ellis (QBHP), and Jenny Graves (QBHP) were sprayed either in their faces, or about their person, causing discomfort in the eyes, nose, and throat. All of the victims complained of irritation in their eyes as well as their throats. Christian Spratt was also slapped by [redacted]

I was advised by staff that [redacted] was contained in an isolation room and was banging on the door and window. I contacted the Juvenile Intake staff as [redacted] was court ordered to be at the Youth Home and was assigned a probation officer. I informed the intake officer, Marty Carder, of the four counts of Battery in the 2nd Degree and Ms. Carder informed me that they would intake [redacted] on at their facility.

I was then assisted by Sgt. Darr and Recruit Booth in making entry into the isolation room to place [redacted] under arrest. [redacted] was taken into custody without incident and escorted to Sgt. Darr's patrol car.

I spoke with the lead clinical therapist, Peyton Woodruff, and asked what set [redacted] off to act this way. Peyton stated another resident was acting out and, as per policy, they told all the other residents to go to their rooms. [redacted] was mad that [redacted] was being told to go to [redacted] room and became so irate that [redacted] began screaming, cursing, and then grabbed the fire extinguisher and began expelling it everywhere, and also slapped one staff member. There is a video and audio recording of the incident. The staff is getting the video burned to a DVD and it will be picked up as soon as it's ready. It will then be submitted to evidence.

Once [redacted] was transported to Juvenile Intake, the nurse said [redacted] had to be medically cleared because she had heard [redacted] could have been hitting [redacted] head on the wall. I took [redacted] to UAMS ER and [redacted] was seen by a doctor. The doctor saw no reason medically necessary to conduct any further tests after his assessment of [redacted] there was also no complaint of any pain from [redacted]

I then transported [redacted] back to Juvenile Intake and turned [redacted] over to the officers on duty.
