Updates to the buildings and grounds are as follows:

Facility has removed carpet in the Gym and will replace it with new carpet.

Currently painting the building.

Currently gathering new estimates for new flooring in children's areas.

New cameras are installed, but the new system for the cameras has to be merged with their current system.

Facility has received new cafeteria tables.

Visit conducted from 1130-1300

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**Narrative:**

Licensing Specialist discussed incident involving staff [REDACTED] and resident [REDACTED] that took place on [REDACTED]/21.

[REDACTED] statements collected by staff, and review of the restraint justification packet it was determined that the resident was actively kicking and spitting on staff prompting the restraint hold by staff [REDACTED]. The resident was no injured and there is no video footage of the incident.

Licensing Complaint is unfounded.

Licensing Specialist discussed resident [REDACTED] phone call to his aunt reporting suspected child abuse. Staff monitoring the call was unable to hear what the resident was saying to his aunt so she did not suspect child maltreatment.

Specialist discussed ensuring all staff monitoring phone calls or on the floor who suspect child maltreatment report suspicions to the child abuse hotline.
