Notice of Incident

Incident Description: Client [REDACTED] was outside and got upset with another peer in the house. [REDACTED] was upset because she confronted the other peer and stated that she was upset because she broke up with her. I had to put [REDACTED] and the other peer on peer limit because they were arguing and not supposed to be dating. When it was time to go back inside for lunch, [REDACTED] and the other peers walked back to the house. [REDACTED] was in the back of the line as they lined up to go inside the house. Once I put the key in the door to go back inside, [REDACTED] took off running towards the street. [REDACTED] ran towards the street and went into the woods. [REDACTED] then escaped the woods and ran back onto the main road and started running. While she was running a staff member was trying to stop her but he didn't put her in a restraint. [REDACTED] kept running and got past the staff that was by her. [REDACTED] ran and walked about three fourths of a mile before we caught up with her and restrained her. When we caught up to her [REDACTED] was still trying to run and escape. [REDACTED] stated that she wanted to "kill herself" and tried multiple times to get hit by a car while we were blocking her runway. Once the van arrived, two other staff members that came from the van explained to [REDACTED] that she can either get up and walk to the van or we will have to restrain her and take her to the van. [REDACTED] tried to escape again so three staff members had to carry her into the van. Once in the van [REDACTED] was trying to break the windows but she wasn't successful. Once back at the house a few staff members talked to [REDACTED] and tried to calm her down while she was still in the van before she goes back inside the house. After staff talked with [REDACTED] walked into the house on her own and didn't have any problems once she got inside.

Agency's Interim Corrective Action: Restraint initiated to keep client safe. Client reportedly calmed down and remains at facility.

Details from Follow-up: Email from Youth Home: Client [REDACTED] Milieu Note from 6/7/22: Client woke up on time and ate her allowed amount at breakfast. She completed her hygiene and participated in goals group. Her goal today was to be polite to peers and staff, and she reported feeling disappointed. Client reported that she met her goal for Monday, which was to 'show T-2 behavior by not running.' She participated in the house's fire drill. Client participated in rec group disc golf, and she was engaged by the activity. During free time in the house, client played cards and listened to music on the portable radios. She tested limits by talking to her peer limit, for which she was redirected. Client accused staff of "being rude" for reminding her to follow her peer limit. Nursing Note from today 6/8/22: Pt presented to the nurses' station in an irritable mood due to her wanting to get off eyeball and run risk precaution. Pt was reminded that this nurse asked Provider on yesterday evening, and was told that he would evaluate on Thursday during med checks. Pt become very angry and started demanding to speak with provider. Patient was redirected and informed that there would not be further discussion. No physical complaints verbalized. Will continue to monitor and follow treatment plan. Email from facility 6/9/22: [REDACTED] is on eyeball, front of house, and run risk but may come off after med checks today. Per shift notes it appears her mood has been up and down, including a comment on the 7th that she would self harm if not taken off of eyeball. If precaution statuses change, I will follow up. Email 6/9/22: Client taken off eyeball.
