Runaway Juveniles

On Sunday 4/17/2022 at approximately 0012 hours, I Deputy Barrow was dispatched to Kanis/Roberts Rd. in regards to a welfare concern.

Upon arrival, I recognized the two males as the runaway juveniles I took a report on earlier in the shift (P22-003674). I got out of my patrol unit, called them both by their names, and told them to get in the patrol car. They both complied and I advised dispatch who the two individuals were. I then advised dispatch I would be taking them back to the youth home and to have MEMS meet me there to check them out and make sure they were alright.

I then took them back to the youth home at 20400 Colonel Glenn Rd. where I met with the youth

counselors and MEMS unit 333. MEMS then checked to make sure they did not need and medical attention and then the juveniles were left in the care of their youth counselors.
