### Narrative:

Time of visit: 10:30 to 13:30

Narrative: Licensing Specialist received a complaint on 9/6/2022 that a resident had taken medication not prescribed to him. Specialist reviewed the camera footage for the following areas: BI office, classroom 1, upstairs hall, and upstairs entrance. Specialist observed the residents pushing staff from the entrance of the

doorway to the BI office. Once they gain entrance the residents were searching through the office (lockers, desk, refrigerator, and coffee station). A resident was seen putting something under the desk and another putting something in his pocket. In the hallway, a resident was observed tearing open a package and swallowing a substance. It is unknown to Specialist what he actually swallowed (medication or coffee condiments). Resident assessed by nurse and taken to NEA Emergency Room for evaluation. Specialist spoke with resident and was informed that he had some pills and coffee condiments. Resident admitted to Specialist that he swallowed them both. Resident informed Specialist that he got the medication from another resident who got them from the desk.

Specialist was informed that staff member has been retrained on the importance of monitoring the residents at all times and providing adequate supervision. Also he was informed of the safety risks of why residents are not allowed in the BI office. The director sent out an email to all staff that no residents are allowed into the BI office for any reason. Locks have been purchased for all lockers in the BI office as a secondary safety precaution.

Facility will be cited for R907.2, staff member failed to provide level of supervision to ensure the safety and well-being of the residents at the facility.
