Description:

On Thursday, 06/02/2022 at approximately 1901 hours I responded Code 3 to 2466 S 48th St (Perimeter of The Ozarks) for a Disturbance Call. The caller was a nurse with the Behavioral Care unit advising multiple residents were attacking employees and destroying things. She advised there were five residents total and one of them had a "shank".

Upon my arrival, Officer Hammons (330), Officer Thompson (305) and I were escorted into the secured facility by a staff member. Once we entered the back of the building where the residents were, I observed two females being held by staff members and another female trying to run away from another. Two of the female residents were actively trying to resist staff members aggressively. I assisted Officer Thompson in detaining one of them in handcuffs. She was later identified as [REDACTED]. I then assisted Officer Hammons in detaining the other female being aggressive with staff. She was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was later released after cooperating with Police and staff members. Officer Thompson had to detain a third female as she was actively showing aggression towards staff and him. She was later identified as [REDACTED].

I remained with [REDACTED] as she remained detained and was sitting on the ground in a corner. As Officers on scene were determining if we had charges on any of the detained subjects, residents in a secure location were attempting to set off the emergency sprinkler system in a secure room which would allow the building doors to all unlock. They were successful in setting off the sprinkler system and around twenty female residents came rushing out the door. One of the females began attacking a female staff member by mounting her on the ground and punching at her. Officer Hammons and Sergeant Sparkman (105) pulled the resident off and detained her. The staff members were able to corral the majority of the residents into a hallway except for the ones that were detained by Police. I saw a few staff members run out the back exit towards the south of the building and Sergeant Kaleta (113) took off after them. I heard Sergeant Kaleta on the radio ask for a few more units. I ran towards the south of the building and observed two staff members escort one female resident to the ground. I placed the female in handcuffs as she was attempting to run away from the facility. The same female was later to be identified as the resident who set the sprinkler system off. She was identified as [REDACTED]. I escorted [REDACTED] back into the facility.

I made contact with the original caller identified as Julie Sizemore (DOB: 01/08/1971) who was a resident nurse at the facility. Julie advised that [REDACTED]

██████████ had a makeshift shank that she got from an exit sign and attempted to cut/stab her with it. She advised that the other resident nurse at the facility identified as Les McBride (DOB: 01/11/1962) tried to pull the shank out of ██████████ hand. She advised that he cut his finger when he was retrieving the shank. She advised that she was cut with the shank after ██████████ had passed it to ██████████ and ██████████ came after her with it and cut her on the palm. Julie advised that staff members were pressing charges. At the time we had probable cause to arrest both ██████████ and ██████████ for Battery 2nd (Felony) and Inciting A Riot (Felony). We also had charges on ██████████ for Criminal Mischief 1st (Felony) for setting off the sprinkler system and causing damage to the facility. ██████████ was also charged with Inciting A Riot (Felony).

I was advised by Sergeant Sparkman that another female resident identified as ██████████ was placed under arrest for Battery 2nd X2 (Felony) on LEO. She was also charged with Inciting A Riot (Felony) and Resisting Arrest (Misdemeanor). I was advised that another female resident identified as ██████████ was charged with Assault 2nd for Assaulting a staff member and Inciting A Riot (Felony). The staff member she assaulted was identified as Darian McNeill (W/M DOB: 02/18/1993).

Officers escorted all arrestees to the prison transport van. Officer Bowen (337) and Officer Wagner (419) transported all the juvenile females to Washington County Juvenile Detention Center. Officer Thompson and I retrieved written statements from all staff members involved in the incident and Officer Thompson took photographs. I retrieved the shank and later logged it into evidence as evidence of Battery 2nd.

Description:

On June 2, 2022 at approximately 2000 hours I, Officer Hoffman, 374 was on another call for service when I heard Officer Hammons, 330 request for more units to upgrade to him. I heard screaming in the background of the Officers' radio traffic on the same call. Due to the severity I upgraded my response to 2466 S. 48th st.

I arrived on scene and was let in by another Officer holding the door open. The fire alarm was sounding and the lights were flashing. I observed Sgt Sparkman, 105 in the hallway holding a female who was lying prone with handcuffs. The female was later identified as ██████████. ██████████ was screaming at the top of her lungs and actively fighting Sgt. Sparkman. I held ██████████ shoulders so she could not resist officers and attempt to roll over. When ██████████ seemingly calmed down, officers assisted her to sit up. ██████████ continued to scream at the top of her lungs. ██████████ stated, "You're fucking hurting me; I have a right to hurt you if you're hurting me." With ██████████ seemingly calmer, Sgt Sparkman walked away. ██████████ stood up and walked towards the door to the inside. I advised ██████████ to sit down and told her she was not free to go where she wished right then. ██████████ did not listen. I forced ██████████ to sit down. ██████████ screamed in my face. ██████████ then swung her leg legs and began kicking. ██████████ started kicking both legs at my face. One of the kicks made contact with my eye and scratched my eyelid. I grabbed both of ██████████ legs with my arms and called out to Sgt. Sparkman. Sgt. Sparkman assisted with rolling ██████████ back onto her stomach in the prone position. ██████████ began crying and yelling. My nose started dripping and my eyes started watering from being kicked. Sgt Kaleta, 113 arrived on scene with me. After ██████████ seemingly calmed down again, Sgt Kaleta assisted sitting her up. ██████████ then hit her head on the door she was sitting against. ██████████ stated, "I want to fucking kill myself." ██████████ was asked if she really wanted to kill herself to which she replied, "Yes, I really want to kill myself. I'm in handcuffs and I'm fucking depressed, what do you think." ██████████ began to hit her head against the door again. ██████████ then kicked at Sgt Kaleta and was laid out on her back. Myself and Sgt Kaleta attempted to roll ██████████ over to her stomach. ██████████ resisted the direction we rolled. Officer King, 338 assisted controlling ██████████. We asked the doctors if there was some medication ██████████ could be administered that would help to calm her down. Leg shackles were placed on ██████████ to prevent her from kicking anyone else. ██████████ was administered two shots in her right upper arm by the staff. After ██████████ was controlled Sgt Kaleta advised me her shoulder was hurt.

█████ was escorted to my patrol unit. I searched █████ person. █████ was placed in my patrol unit and her seatbelt was secured. Due to █████ making suicidal statements, I transported █████ to AR Children's Hospital with another officer following. At that time █████ was calmed down significantly. At the hospital █████ was not corporative or compliant with hospital staff. Hospital staff advised they would not be able to find a placement for █████ due to her aggressive behavior. I asked █████ if she was suicidal. █████ stated she was not. I asked █████ why she made statements saying she wanted to kill herself. █████ stated it was because she was frustrated. █████ stated to take her to JDC. Hospital cleared █████ medically and she was released.

Officer Sparkman advised me █████ charges were Resisting Arrest, Inciting a Riot (FELONY), Battery 2nd X2 (FELONY).

I placed █████ back in my patrol unit and secured her seatbelt. I transported █████ down to Juvenile Detention Center. Another officer completed the prelim and faxed it to JDC. █████ was turned over to JDC intake Officer.

Officer Thompson, 305 took pictures of the injury to my eye. I had a small scratch on my right eyelid. Due to the sensitive area, the scratch hurt constantly and I had even more pain when blinking. Later in the night the area also bruised. I also had a bruise which turned purple and pain on my left knee which was obtained while attempting to control █████

Upon arrival other Officers and I made entrance into the facility and as we were walking into the main lobby we observed approximately four residence yelling and pushing staff members. We began attempting to calm the situation down but it was not working to the point we had to go hands on with multiple subjects and place them in handcuffs. The first subject I grabbed and placed handcuffs on was identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was later taken out of handcuffs due to no charges being filed against her and her agreeing to calm down.

As we were waiting with the original four subjects we began overhearing subjects in another holding area yelling they were going to break the sprinkler system. I asked the staff what would happen if they break it and I was advised it would flood the area and would initiate a failsafe where all the doors in the building would become unlocked.

I heard a loud bang and immediately after an immense amount of water began pouring out of the area. Once we heard the doors begin to unlock a female identified as [REDACTED] began running out of the area where the sprinkler was broken and started fighting staff. [REDACTED] was punching a staff member with closed fist's, as Sgt. Sparkman #105 and I began making our way to her we observed the area we were in begin to flood with multiple female juveniles from all areas of the facility.

When we made it to [REDACTED] we took her to the ground and she immediately tucked her arms under her chest. We asked her multiple times to put her hands behind her back and she refused. Once #105 and I were able to get both arms out and placed in handcuffs we stood her up and #105 walked her to another area of the facility. As he was forcing her out of the original area another subject began pushing staff and other officers attempting to get to [REDACTED]. Once staff had he moved away from the door a subject identified as [REDACTED] who was already in handcuffs begin to try and open the door to where [REDACTED] was moved to.

Officer Thompson #305 and I began walking [REDACTED] back to the area she was in and we observed the original subject who was attempting to get to [REDACTED] pushing a staff member. When we attempted to help the staff member [REDACTED] got in between us and them and refused to move. [REDACTED] was asked multiple times to step aside and she refused I grabbed [REDACTED] and placed her on the ground until a staff member could hold her. Once a staff member was able to hold [REDACTED] #305 and I grabbed the subject pushing the staff member and took her to the ground. Once on the ground she was placed in handcuffs and sat up.

As we begin to plan how we are going to get all in custody out of the building I observe [REDACTED] is still refusing to calm down by kicking and attempting to roll on two officers. When Officer King #338 advised he had some leg shackles in his car I threw him a key fob to the building and took his place in holding down [REDACTED] by crossing her ankles and holding them to her backside. Once #338 arrived back with leg shackles we placed them on [REDACTED] with no incident. Officer Hoffman #374 advised she could hold [REDACTED] on her own so I got off [REDACTED] until we decided on an exit plan.

Once an exit plan was decided I assisted [REDACTED] to her feet and other officers began escorting her to the exit to be detained in a car. Officer Thoel #390 and I then assisted [REDACTED] off the ground and escorted her to the transport van waiting out the exit. Once handed over to other officers watching the van I returned back into the facility to escort another subject out to the van. Once all subjects were escorted out and placed into the van we cleared the scene. Officer Bowen #337 and Officer Wagner #419 were handed all detained subjects in the van.///MRH330///

Description:

On 06/02/2022 at 2017 hours I arrived at Woodridge Behavioral Care to assist officers with a disturbance between multiple juvenile residents inside the building. Prior to my arrival I heard Officer Hammons #330 say over the radio he needed more units to respond code three to his location and they were running out of handcuffs while trying to get the situation under control.

Once I arrived I was told by Lt. Pena #115 to move patrol vehicles out of the way so the prisoner transport van could come into the parking lot. After I did so I went back into the building to see what I could do to help. When I walked in I saw the floor in the main area completely flooded with water and four juvenile females in handcuffs. I was looking for Sergeant Sparkman #105 to see what he needed me to do and once I found him I Sergeant Kaleta #113 told me to look for Julie Sizemore (W/F dob: 01/08/1972) who was the nurse who worked at Woodridge. Ms. Sizemore advised me that [REDACTED] one of the residents, had stabbed her hand with a shank. She was not able to give me much more information due to her being on the phone with the CEO of the company. She told me [REDACTED] had broken a fire sprinkler head in one of the rooms which caused the flooding and showed me the room. In the room everything was covered in black, moldy water including the walls, tables, and other furniture.

After I spoke with Ms. Sizemore I assisted Officer Barnett #363 in taking [REDACTED] into custody and over to the prisoner transport van. The rest of my time at this location I was standing in the hallway in case I was needed by other officers.

MVR and BWC were active

On Thursday June 2, 2022 at approximately 19:01 hours I responded to 2466 S 48th St. (Perimeter Behavioral of the Ozarks) for a call of a disturbance. A staff member named Julie advised that multiple residents were attacking employees and destroying things. Julie also stated that one person had a "shank" and dispatch advised that they could hear screaming and crying in the background.

Upon arrival Officer Hammons #330, Officer Barnett #363 and I were escorted by a staff member into the facility. While walking through the hallway I could hear yelling. Once in the main part of the facility I observed two females being restrained by staff members and another female was walking freely. A female in a black shirt later identified as [REDACTED] was being restrained by a staff member while screaming

and attempting to pull away. I attempted to speak with [REDACTED] and she told me that her name was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] continued screaming and pulling away and it became clear that she was not going to cooperate. [REDACTED] was handcuffed and sat on the ground. While detaining [REDACTED] I observed a different female fall on the ground behind me and continued arguing with and trying to get around a staff member.

The female, who was later identified as [REDACTED] told me that she was not willing to calm down before attempting to punch me. [REDACTED] was placed in handcuffs that were double locked and checked for fit. After being detained [REDACTED] was told to sit on the ground. While [REDACTED] was sitting on the ground Julie Sizemore (W/F DOB: 01/08/1971) was making a phone call. [REDACTED] overheated Julie say that she and [REDACTED] had assaulted staff and [REDACTED] began yelling that she hadn't assaulted anyone. [REDACTED] was smiling and spontaneously stated that said that she had touched both of the nurses. Another female was detained by Officer Hammons and [REDACTED] continued yelling, moving around, and threatening staff. [REDACTED] actions were continuing to aggravate [REDACTED] and the other female so in an attempt to better control the room [REDACTED] was moved to a more isolated room. Multiple times while Julie was walking by [REDACTED] would yell and curse at her. Occasionally [REDACTED] would also yell across the room if there was a staff member she recognized. [REDACTED] said that everything started because she didn't like the staff or facility and nothing was done when she was attacked by other residents earlier in the day. [REDACTED] was given two shots by staff to help her relax.

While waiting the fire alarm went off and I was informed that the residents had broken one of the sprinklers. The doors inside of the facility were unlocked and residents moved into the main room. Sgt. Sparkman #105 took one female later identified as [REDACTED] into the hallway and [REDACTED] began yelling and moving towards them. Shortly afterwards a staff member identified as Darian McNeil (W/M DOB: 02/18/1993) was seen attempting to stop a female from going into the hallway after [REDACTED]. The female was identified as [REDACTED]. As [REDACTED] continued to fight with Darian Officer Hammons and I began moving towards them in order to detain [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] moved into the way to obstruct us and was told to move. [REDACTED] refused and was placed onto the ground by Officer Hammons and I. I then moved to [REDACTED] and grabbed her left arm. [REDACTED] attempted to pull away as Officer Hammons grabbed her other arm and she was placed on the ground and put into handcuffs. I checked for fit and double locked the handcuffs. [REDACTED] was rolled over and sat up. After the fire alarm had gone off water continued spreading from the pod behind the blue door and into the main room causing substantial damage. As the alarm was going off we were also informed that some of the residents had exited the back door of the building and were attempting to run away. The Springdale Fire Department arrived on scene to shut off the fire alarm.

While waiting with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] another female was brought into the open room in handcuffs. The female was identified later as [REDACTED]. Other staff entered the facility and [REDACTED] spontaneously said "are ya'll going to charge me for the window?". I told [REDACTED] that they were looking at the water damage and she laughed saying "I helped". [REDACTED] told me that her right hand was hurting and asked if I could move the handcuff. I agreed and [REDACTED] immediately got angry due to me touching her arm. I moved the cuff into the proper position and checked for fit. While waiting to determine if the facility wanted to press charges [REDACTED] stated that she was the one who broke a window and broke the sprinkler off of the ceiling causing the fire alarm to go off and causing substantial water damage to the facility. [REDACTED] also stated that she helped in breaking the window. While waiting [REDACTED] said that she was hallucinating and requested medication. I alerted Les and he brought her the medication shortly afterwards. I was informed that we had charges on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and they were taken to the transport van. I was informed by staff that we did not have charges on [REDACTED] and released her from handcuffs. However I was misinformed and observed shortly afterwards that [REDACTED] was taken to the transport van. I handed out statements to the staff present during the time of the incident. I took photographs of the damage, injuries to both registered nurse Les McBride and registered nurse Julie Sizemore, and of the weapon used by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

Staff member Jason Golden informed me shortly after being handed a statement that he did not want to fill one out, he gave contact information if needed. I turned all statements over to Officer Barnett. All photographs were uploaded to the Springdale server.

Based on my observations and statements made by [REDACTED] I had probable cause to charge her with criminal mischief 1st (felony) for purposefully causing over \$1000 worth of damage to the facility by breaking the sprinkler and the window to the door. It is unknown at this time what the full damage amount is. I also had probable cause to charge [REDACTED] for assault 2nd for striking at Darian putting him in a situation where he was likely to receive physical injury.

BWC ACTIVE

On June 2, 2022 at approximately 1903 hours, I responded to 2466 S 48th Street (Perimeter Behavioral of the Ozarks) for a disturbance. The caller said there were multiple residents attacking employees and destroying things. There had been a window broken and one of the girls had armed themselves with a "shank." Perimeter Behavioral of the Ozarks is an inpatient care facility servicing a large number of girls from the ages of 6 to 17 with severe behavioral issues.

Upon my arrival, I was let into the unit by a staff member, because all the doors are locked in this facility. Once I made it to where Officers Hammons, Thompson, and Barnett were, I found there were 4 juvenile females around the room handcuffed. The girls were yelling and feeding off the loud threats of violence of the others. I asked the officers to separate the females to the best of their abilities and the girls were moved away from each other, which reduced the amount of yelling and agitation. While there were 4 girls in handcuffs, there were still other residents milling about the area; however, they were not causing a problem at the moment. I attempted to speak with the staff, and was directed to the head nurse, Julie. Nurse Julie was obviously overwhelmed and was trying to speak with me, while also taking medical orders over the phone and notifying the management of the facility simultaneously. In the preliminary stages, I was able to determine there was an outburst by several girls, which resulted in a window being broken. After the window was broken, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had both brandished a large piece of glass at different points and stabbed Nurse Julie's partner Nurse and cut Ms. Julie's hand. Nurse Julie told me she wished to pursue a criminal case; however, she wished to administer the ordered medications before we finished the report. I told her if that would calm the residents down, it was probably best to prioritize that.

While Nurse Julie was administering medications, the girl who was wandering the unit began to become more and more hostile. A staff member was chasing her from one side of the room to the other and the girl was repeatedly striking the staff member, who did not seem concerned with the actions. The girl then walked to one of the handcuffed girls and began to put her hands on her and push down on her back with the handcuffed girl on her stomach. The staff member made no effort to prevent this. I quickly went over and pulled the girl off the handcuffed girl and placed the wandering girl in handcuffs and asked her to also sit down in the room. She no longer caused problems in the room after being restrained and asked to sit in the spot. The handcuffed girl, [REDACTED] told me she did not like cops and our presence "pissed her off." I told her if she would remain calm for 3 consecutive minutes, I would have the handcuffs removed and she agreed. 3 minutes later [REDACTED] was removed from handcuffs and staff escorted her to another area of the unit.

Approximately 20 minutes later, the nursing staff was at a place they could give me further details on the status of the 2 females which they wished to pursue a criminal case against. While speaking with Nurse Julie, an urgent call for her came over the radio again. Nurse Julie ran out of the room and I followed. I saw several girls in the room coughing and gagging. I heard the staff talking about a sprinkler head that had been broken. This would cause the fire alarm to go off and unlock every door in the facility; interior and exterior. One of the staff members came to me and told me she needed help because the girl who had broken the sprinkler was very violent. As several girls came out of the room, he pointed out the girl he believed broke the sprinkler. She was calmly walking with the other girls to another room and I made a mental note of which girl it was. Not 5 seconds later, I heard one of the staff members yell, "No!" and run into another room. As he ran into another room, the girl he had pointed out as being violent ran up and began punching a kicking a small female staff member. I ran over to help and the girl, later identified as: [REDACTED] attempted a bicycle kick at me which I deflected with my hands. Seeing [REDACTED] was obviously a danger to staff and officers, I rolled her to her stomach and attempted to handcuff her. She drew her arms underneath her and I asked for her to give me her hands, which she refused. Officer Hammons came to assist me. I conducted an arm crank on her right arm and then allowed Officer Hammons to remove the right arm. I placed [REDACTED] into handcuffs checking them for proper fit and double locking them. I helped [REDACTED] and walked her over to a separate corner to separate her as best as possible, being an agitator. While walking with [REDACTED] I felt my duty belt pull away from my waist and I told [REDACTED] not to touch my belt. She got angry at this and began attempting to violently pull away towards the crowd of girls again. I almost lost my grip on [REDACTED] and conducted an escort takedown to roll [REDACTED] onto her butt. [REDACTED] again bicycle kicked me in the chest. I used my arms to trap her ankle against my chest. I was concerned if I held her ankle against my bullet resistant vest, it would hurt her ankle. I disengaged by pushing her feet away from me, causing her to flip over backwards and onto her backside. [REDACTED] shouting and violent behavior was beginning to excite the room again. I instructed a staff member to open the door to the unit and I pulled [REDACTED] out into the hallway by herself in order to remove her from the crowd. While in the hallway, [REDACTED] continued to yell, attempt to run away, and kick me. She stood up and began shouldering into a staff member guarding the door. I again took [REDACTED] by the arm and dragged her away from the door while she screamed. I had to stand with Ms. [REDACTED] and keep her from running away or assaulting staff members.

Once other officers began to arrive on scene, I started attempting to direct resources where needed. There was a fire alarm which needed turn off, a sprinkler head flooding the building, tens of violent teenage girls, several of which fled the facility when the fire alarm opened the exterior door. Officer Hoffman arrived and I directed her to take control of [REDACTED] while I began solving the various other problems.

When I made it back into the main room, it had mostly calmed with the problem girls separated and being watched over. I compiled the information for the 5 girls we now had criminal offenses against including: [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had assaulted a staff member after the sprinkler was broken, and [REDACTED] was determined to be the one who had broken the sprinkler. The behavior of these 5 engaged in conduct which emboldened others to act in a manner which was dangerous for staff and officers. There was also property damaged as a direct result of their behaviors. I was told by staff they wished to pursue a criminal case against all 5 of these juveniles. While compiling the information, I spoke with Sergeant Kaleta who was using her belt to support her right arm. I asked about her arm and she said she injured it while restraining [REDACTED] and Officer Hoffman had been kicked in the face. I notified Washington County Juvenile Intake and spoke with Linda. I was told they would be detaining all 5 juveniles with a court date of June 3, 2022 at 0830AM. I told Linda all the juveniles were ready for transport and due to having adult males in our booking facility, the juveniles could not go to our facility. I asked if we could bring the juveniles straight to the Juvenile Detention Center and provide the preliminary paperwork as soon as possible. She agreed and I told her the juveniles would be arriving in the next 30 minutes, so the staff could prepare.

Once Officers Wagner and Bowen arrived at JDC, the juveniles were refused entry until the proper paperwork could be faxed to the facility. I attempted to call and speak with a supervisor; however, it was relayed to me it was their policy no one was accepted until the preliminary report had been delivered to the facility. I was provided with the wrong fax number to the facility on the first attempt to send the preliminary reports, and Officer Thompson faxed and emailed copies of the preliminary reports as soon as they were completed and I approved them. This delay caused the juveniles to remain handcuffed for well over 3 hours. It took approximately 2 hours for the juveniles to be accepted into the facility.

Description:

On June 2, 2022 I responded to 2466 S. 48th St after Officers on scene had requested additional units. Due to Officers having already been on scene for a lengthy amount of time and the radio traffic having had a lot of background noise I upgraded my response to get there as quickly as I could.

Upon arrival I was let into the facility by a staff member and saw SGT Sparkman in the hallway with a female later identified as [REDACTED] who was detained in handcuffs. I was directed to go into the next room where other Officers were on scene with more detained individuals. I saw staff members running outside and went to assist them with a female, later identified as [REDACTED] who was actively resisting their efforts to detain her as she attempted to run away. I saw [REDACTED] trying to pull from the staff members and I instructed them to take her to the ground where I knew she could be better controlled. Officer Barnett had arrived on scene as they went to the ground and he immediately detained [REDACTED] in handcuffs. I then went to assist other staff members with a group of girls who had also exited the facility however they were being cooperative and I went back to assist with [REDACTED] and getting her inside.

After a few minutes I went to assist Officer Hoffman who was with [REDACTED] in the hallway. [REDACTED] was on the ground and crying hysterically. My attempt to talk to [REDACTED] was instantly shut down and she did not want to listen to calm down. [REDACTED] was asking for a specific staff member who I asked to come talk to her in an attempt to calm her down. After the staff member spoke with her and she seemed calmer I decided to sit [REDACTED] up to keep her from being on her stomach for a prolonged period. I told [REDACTED] that if she kicked us again she would be back on the ground and asked her if she understood me. [REDACTED] told me that she understood and she was put into a seated position with her back against the wall. [REDACTED] immediately began to bag her head against the wall and was told to stop.

[REDACTED] was making statements about wanting to kill herself and was working up her emotions again. After a short time [REDACTED] began to bang her head against the wall again and I had to stop her by placing my hand between her head and the wall, warning her that she would end up on the ground again. After [REDACTED] began to yell at me again I tried to talk to her about going to the hospital for her suicidal statements however she got a very big attitude and attempted to kick me which I was able to push away. [REDACTED] then turned and kicked at Officer Hoffman and the two of us laid her back on the ground with Officer Hoffman taking a mount position facing her legs and holding [REDACTED] legs down to keep her from kicking. I called for another Officer to come assist us in rolling [REDACTED] back over. I told Officer Hoffman to get up on her knees and reached both of my hands down grabbing at [REDACTED] right arm. I told Officer Hoffman to roll [REDACTED]

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towards the wall and to get up on her knees to allow us to roll her. While trying to roll [REDACTED] I was pulling up on her arm and I felt a pop in my right shoulder followed by a numbing and tingling feeling.

After [REDACTED] was secure on the ground and continued to yell and screamed that she did not want our help. I called for leg shackles to help control [REDACTED] and asked the staff if they could do anything to help calm her down. We had to hold [REDACTED] on the ground and after a few minutes my right shoulder began to really cause me pain as I regained my feelings with a burning sensation in my shoulder. I had to hold [REDACTED] down with my left hand until the nurse brought a shot for her and I had to use my right arm to assist. [REDACTED] was taken out to a patrol car shortly thereafter to be assessed at Arkansas Children's Hospital.

Due to injury I sustained while controlling [REDACTED] a count of Battery 2nd on a Law Enforcement Officer was added.
