Report Description: Name: , DOB: , Notified: Sh'Queria Baker On 3/6/23 at approximately 1500, resident became agitated related to not feeling well. She refused to return to her unit and had to be escorted back by staff. Once she was on the unit, she attempted to use her shirt as a ligature but was intercepted by staff before she was able to wrap the shirt around her neck. Staff had to physically block resident related to multiple and continued self-harm attempts. Eventually, related to being an imminent risk to herself, had to be placed in a physical hold. She was released when she was able to self-regulate. No injuries sustained from behaviors or hold. About an hour later, resident was involved in a physical altercation with other peers due to a verbal disagreement. She physically hit others and was hit by others. She sustained superficial scratch marks on the right side of her neck caused by one of the peers. Scratches were cleaned by RN. They were separated and resident was removed from the unit to the comfort room. In relation to this event, resident attempted to use her paper scrubs to tie around her neck but was intercepted by RN. Due to continued attempts at self-harm resident was placed in a second brief physical hold. Once she was calm and emotions were regulated, the restraint was released. In relation to these events, resident will be on assault precautions for 7 days and suicide precautions with constant line of sight per the therapist until safe behaviors are observed.

Licensing Narrative:Unannounced licensing visit walk through today. Resident is currently restricted to unit and was completing schoolwork at a desk within LOS of 2 staff members. She was wearing paper scrubs. She spoke with administrator and licensing specialist as we were walking through, and her manner was calm and appropriate. Staff were observed interacting with the residents on unit restriction in a calm and appropriate manner. No need for additional licensing follow up at this time.
