Pt began to cuss and yell more at staff and make threaten remarks saying he was going to fight a peer. Pt threw a chair and postured as if he was going to fight peer by walking towards his direction. 2:47pm Personal Restraint: After flipping multiple chairs and being redirected to calm down Pt had to be restrained and escorted into the seclusion room where he continued to be aggressive and try to come out 2:48pm Personal Restraint End: Pt was constantly trying to get pass staff to get to peer. Staff was asking him to calm down. 2:49pm Locked Seclusion: Pt was cussing and banging on the seclusion room door, and window. Staff was talking to Pt trying to get him to calm down and talk about out the situation. 2:54pm Locked Seclusion End: Locked seclusion ended at this time due to the Pt being unsafe and attempting to choke himself. staff had to intervene. 2:55pm Personal Restraint: Due to attempting to choke himself the Pt was placed in a personal restraint at this time. The Pt struggled against the staff 2:57pm Personal Restraint End: Pt started to become calm and sat down in the corner of the room. Staff continued to monitor Pt to make sure he was ok and or if he needed anything. 2:58pm Unlocked Seclusion: Pt began to talk to staff about why he got so upset. Staff processed with Pt and made sure he remained calm and asked if he needed anything. 3:10pm Unlocked Seclusion End: Pt contracted to safety and understood information that was given to him. Pt was able to leave seclusion room and go back to his room. Patient Debriefing date/time: 12/19/22

4:00pm: Pt was able to understand his behavioral and accept that he could have done things in a better manner. Pt recognized his behavior and contracted to be safe and talk to staff when things get out of hand. Pt also contracted to the safety of removing himself from the situation before intervention is needed. Nursing Face to Face Assessment date/time: 12/19/22 3:18pm: Pt was assessed at this time. Pt was tearful and angry saying "I didnt do anything." Pt has no bruising, redness or swelling to his neck where he tried to choke himself. No injury noted. Pt denies injury at this time. Pt denies pain. Pt is hyperfocused on being on precautions, Freeze due to an outing tomorrow. No redness or bruising noted to bilateral arms/legs. Guardian was notified on 12/19/22 at 3:25pm

Interim Action Narrative: Resident was placed in a personal restraint when found unsafe by attempting to choke himself. He was assessed by nursing. No redness, swelling, or bruising noted. Resident processed with staff.

Licensing Narrative: Licensing Specialist will follow-up with facility to view camera footage and if any precautions were implemented. Licensing Specialist viewed camera footage for the 12/19/2022 incident at Chestnut House. Licensing Specialist observed resident throwing chairs in the milieu. The other residents were informed to go to their bedrooms for safety. Licensing Specialist observed resident being restrained and escorted to the seclusion room (ratio 2:1) because of his aggression. Once in the seclusion room, resident was observed trying to get out of the room. When the door became locked (locked seclusion) resident began hitting the door. Resident was stating something, but Licensing Specialist could not understand what was said because of the echo in the room when resident was yelling. Resident dropped to the floor and was heard crying while lying on his stomach. There was a ball inside of the seclusion room. Resident picked up the ball and was observed biting on the ball and spitting out pieces. Staff asked resident to stop biting the ball. Resident yelled at staff and threw the ball against a wall. Staff entered the seclusion room (ratio 2:10), resident was trying to choke himself. Staff was able to get resident to calm down and process while he was in unlock seclusion. Resident was able to contract with staff. Jon Pulliam, Lead Unit Manager, and Licensing Specialist discussed the ball that was left in the seclusion room that resident tore up. Facility will be cited for R911.6, a ball was left inside of the seclusion room before the resident arrived.
