Runaway Juvnile

On Sunday May 14, 2023 around 1304 hours I, Deputy Jones, was dispatched to 20400 Colonel Glenn for a runaway juvenile. Communications advised that the juvenile would be headed East on Colonel Glenn wearing a grey shirt and black shorts.

As I approached the intersection of Colonel Glenn and Burlingame, I was advised by communications that a white van full of employees would be also looking for the juvenile and would flag me down when they spotted me. I observed a white van turn at the intersection of Colonel Glenn and Dogwood Lane, I then followed the van. I then observed the employees of the youth home make contact with the juvenile, who then turned and punched David Barnes in the face, at which time the employees had taken to the ground. I then placed in cuffs double locking them due to her being aggressive.

Once in cuffs the workers then began noticing start to try to use the cuffs to hurt herself they then attempted to stop her from doing so. I then tried to redo the cuffs to help the situation, when undoing one of the cuffs began to resist giving me her arm back. I then began to grab the arm with the cuff placing my knee on it and struggled to grab the free arm. then began to take her free arm and attempted to choke and bite herself, she had also began banging her head on the ground. The employees attempted to stop her by grabbing her head while I was reaching for her arm. During this altercation I had pulled out my OC spray and told her multiple times that if she wouldn't calm down I was going to spray her. The employees and I were able to

get the free hand cuffed again and then picked up to place her in the back of my patrol unit.

Once in the back of my unit had then spit on one of the employees. I then went to try to talk to who began banging her head against part of my patrol unit. David then got on the other side of my unit and used his arm to block for hitting her head. then began to raise her feet and feeling like she was going to start kicking I grabbed her feet trying to hold them down to keep her from kicking. At this time I was kicked in the knee and groin area while trying to restrain

I then suggested to get her out of the car and have her stand up to where would could have more control over. Once getting out of the car she began to bang her head against the patrol unit. David once again used his arm to stop her, at which point began to purposely step on my feet using her heel to do so. After asking her multiple times to stop finally complied due to her feeling faint because of the heat.

I then requested Mems to go ahead and come give aid due to looking faint and to check on David and I. MEMS personal arrived on scene and began to run vitals on at the same time Sgt. Wheeler and Deputy Marler had arrived and I informed them of the situation and what would happen from there.

Mems then transported to children's hospital and Sgt. Wheeler had followed them there just in case another incident.
