Case Narrative**

On June 25th, 2023, at approximately 12:01 PM, I was dispatched to Piney Ridge, 2805 East Zion Road, for an assault and battery report. The caller stated his son was assaulted a few days ago by another child at the facility.

When I arrived on scene, I met with the caller/victim's father, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated on June 22nd, Piney Ridge called him and advised his son was involved in an altercation with another child. They told [REDACTED] his son was okay, but it was up to him if he wanted to press charges. [REDACTED] spoke with his son, [REDACTED], on today's date, and [REDACTED] stated he wanted to press charges.

I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated on Thursday morning, he was talking with his friend's, and another child overheard. The other child, identified as [REDACTED], thought [REDACTED] was talking about him. [REDACTED] approached [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] was sitting in a chair against a wall. [REDACTED] stated there were kids sitting on either side of him and he could not get out. [REDACTED] began swinging at [REDACTED] with closed fists, hitting him nine times total with both his right and left fists. [REDACTED] stated he was able to cover up his face with his arms, and [REDACTED] hit him three or four more times in the chest. [REDACTED] stated after the incident, he had bruising on his left cheek bone. I did not observe any bruising at the time of the report. [REDACTED] stated there were cameras that would have captured the incident.

I spoke with Alisha Baker W/F [REDACTED], the nurse on duty at the time of the altercation. Baker stated her office did not have a direct line of sight of where [REDACTED] was sitting when he was attacked, but she walked out when she heard the commotion. Baker stated she saw everyone standing up, but the altercation was over when she walked over. Baker stated her report included other children's stories that [REDACTED] was hit unprovoked. Baker included the details of the incident in her nurse's report.

The director of Risk Management of Piney Ridge, Ronissa Adams ([REDACTED]), provided me with [REDACTED] guardian information. He is in the custody of DHS. His caseworker is Madison [REDACTED] phone number [REDACTED]. Adams also stated their camera footage expires after three days, so they no longer had footage of the incident.

This case is closed and referred to the prosecutor.
