Corrective Actions Taken: Resident was assessed and checked by nurse. Resident was offered Ibuprofen for pain which he refused to take. The nurse consulted with APRN who recommended that be sent to Forrest City Medical Center for assessment and for X-Ray of his elbow. The diagnosis at Forrest City Medical Center was a 1.5 mm calcification at the anterior tip of the coronoid process of the ulna is probably tiny developmental unfused apophysis, less likely would be an avulsion injury, correlate history of trauma. No significant bony arthritic deformities. No lytic lesions. However, there is evidence of a small elbow joint effusion. Prominent soft tissue edema at the posterior and medical elbow, which could be due to trauma or cellulitis. No soft tissue emphysema. No radiopaque foreign bodies are seen in the soft tissues. Resident sent back to the facility with orders of ibuprofen 3x daily and to see an orthopedic specialist by appointment. Resident placed on activity restriction until further notice by APRN or Nurse per medical assessment. Additional Information: None currently. Guardian Notified: Madison Lee Case Manager DHS
