## Narrative &amp; Statements

## Narrative - Hogan, Wesley - 12/19/2023 7:41:03 AM (Initial)

On 12/18/2023 at approximately 4:45 PM I, Sgt. Wesley Hogan, along with Officer River Byrne of the Fordyce Police Dept. were dispatched to Millcreek of Arkansas at 1828 Industrial Drive in Fordyce, AR 71742 for a runaway juvenile. We arrived on scene and spoke with the staff of Millcreek who stated that the juvenile was named [REDACTED]. I spoke with Mr. Chris Butler the Director of Risk Management at Millcreek who stated that [REDACTED] is from [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] has ADHD and Intermittent Explosive Disorder. They said he is a white male who was last seen wearing black shorts and a black shirt that jumped the back fence and ran into the woods. Ofc. Byrne and I searched the area for a while and then left the scene to another call.

At approximately 5:45 PM we were dispatched back to Millcreek because someone had reported they could hear the juvenile in the woods yelling. Ofc. Byrne and I then made our way to the woods north of Millcreek while Ofc. Jacob Murry went to the main campus of Millcreek. Ofc. Murry called out over the radio that he could see the juvenile and that he was running across the road towards Millcreek. Ofc. Byrne and I then made our way towards Ofc. Murry. As we approached Ofc. Murry's location Ofc. Murry called over the radio that the juvenile [REDACTED] was trying to take control of Ofc. Murry's taser. Ofc. Byrne and I ran to Ofc. Murry and found him and a few members of Millcreek staff had [REDACTED] face down on the ground trying to gain control of his hands. Ofc. Byrne and I assisted him in gaining control of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] refused to give up his hands and continued to pull away and try to fight. Ofc. Murry and I gained control of [REDACTED] hands and placed him into handcuffs. Ofc. Murry and I then escorted [REDACTED] to Ofc. Murry's patrol vehicle. [REDACTED] refused to get into the vehicle as I trying to get him into the vehicle. Once in the vehicle [REDACTED] kept trying to come out of the vehicle. I tried to use the brachial plexus nerve stun with an open hand to gain control of [REDACTED] and missed the target area and caught [REDACTED] in the left side of his face due to [REDACTED] thrashing around while I was trying to get his seat belt buckled. Still unable to safely buckle [REDACTED] into the vehicle I tried to hit his brachial plexus nerve area two more times and missed. After being held at taser point by Ofc. Murry, [REDACTED] then stopped resisting long enough for me to get him buckled in the vehicle. Ofc. Murry then began to transport [REDACTED] to the Dallas County Jail. [REDACTED] began to kick Ofc. Murry's windows and doors. At the jail I put leg shackles onto [REDACTED]. The jail staff informed us that they could not hold [REDACTED] due to him being a juvenile. I called my supervisor Lt. Swiger, he informed us to take [REDACTED] back to Millcreek and have them keep possession of [REDACTED]. I got into the vehicle with Ofc. Murry and rode with him back to Millcreek with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] made several threats to Ofc. Murry and I stating that he was going to kill us. Ofc. Murry and I along with Ofc. Byrne arrived back at Millcreek and removed the handcuffs and leg shackles from Mr. [REDACTED] once Millcreek staff took control of [REDACTED]. All officers then left the scene.

## Narrative - Murry, Steven - 12/19/2023 12:23:46 PM (Initial)

I (Officer Steven Murry) was the second officer to respond to the incident. Upon arrival to the scene, the juvenile identified as ([REDACTED]) was running across the field at millcreek. He was being very aggressive towards staff and everyone trying to calm him down and catch up to him. I then caught up to him, jumped out of my patrol unit and ran to assist the Millcreek workers in restraining him. As i arrived over to him he was screaming and cussing. I tried talking to him to get him to calm down and to pay attention to me, when he decided to reach for my taser to remove it from its holder. I then restrained Mr. [REDACTED] and assisted him to the ground where he was then placed in handcuffs which was double locked and checked for correct tightness, SGT Hogan and I assisted him up and walked him to the patrol unit while he was fighting and cussing us the whole way. He was screaming in SGT Hogans face, he was trying to kick both of us, and was trying to get out of the vehicle when placed inside, Finally after telling him that he would be dry stunned if he continued to fight, he calmed down and let us put the seat belt on him. We closed the door and then started on our way to the Dallas County Detention Center when he unbuckled his seatbelt and started trying to kick my door and my window open. The whole time he was yelling at me that we were " pussy ass hoers" and "Bitch ass niggas" and that he wanted me to pull over so he could show me i wasn't "shit". We finally arrived at the Dallas County Detention Center where they informed us there they couldn't take him there because he was a juvenile. He started head butting the window and tried again to kick the door and the window open. We placed him in leg shackles and transported him back to Millcreek. On the way there he stated that he would have his dad come down and kill all of the officers, also stated that he would grab my Glock and shoot me with it. We arrived at Millcreek where they took custody of him to await further action to be taken.

## Narrative - Byrne, River - 12/19/2023 12:58:50 PM (Initial)

On December 18th, 2023 At approximately 4:50pm I Officer Byrne and Sgt. Hogan were dispatched to the area of Millcreek to look for a runaway juvenile by the name of [REDACTED]. We were notified by Millcreek staff that he was wearing a black shirt and black shorts. Myself and Sgt. Hogan searched the area of Millcreek and Hwy 79 North and South Bound but were unable to locate [REDACTED] at the time. Myself and Sgt. Hogan were dispatched a second time at approximately 6:00pm. Dispatch notified Myself and Sgt. Hogan that [REDACTED] was seen back at the area of Millcreek. Myself and Sgt. Hogan arrived at the residence that called dispatch and [REDACTED] was not in the area. As we began to leave I noticed that there were two vehicles parked in the field in the area of Millcreek. When we got to the scene the staff of Millcreek notified Myself and Sgt. Hogan that [REDACTED] was in the back corner of the field. As we conducted our search Officer Murry arrived on scene. [REDACTED] then fled the area and Officer Murry followed. Upon arriving at Millcreek Officer Murry and Millcreek staff had [REDACTED] on the ground. The Millcreek staff notified us that [REDACTED] attempted to take Officer Murry's Taser out of its holster. We then ran to the area and assisted Officer Murry in detaining [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was being uncompliant and was screaming and cussing at Myself, Sgt. Hogan and Officer Murry. As we escorted [REDACTED] to the vehicle he would not get in the vehicle. Sgt. Hogan and Officer Murry told [REDACTED] that if he did not stop resisting that he was going to get tased. [REDACTED] was then forced into the back of the patrol vehicle by Sgt. Hogan. As Sgt. Hogan was attempting to apply [REDACTED] seat belt [REDACTED] continued screaming and cussing in Sgt. Hogan's face. Sgt. Hogan then made attempts to perform a Brachical Plexus Stun on [REDACTED], The Brachical Plexus Stun is a defensive technique which we were trained upon in the Police Academy. After leaving Millcreek Officer Murry and Sgt. Hogan took [REDACTED] to the Dallas County Detention Center I followed to assist Officer Murry and Sgt. Hogan. Upon arrival the Jailers at Dallas County Detention Center notified us that they could not hold juveniles at the Jail. As we were talking to the Jailers, [REDACTED] started making several attempts to kick out the windows of Officer Murry's Patrol Vehicle. Leg shackles were then placed on [REDACTED] after which [REDACTED] was taken back to Millcreek and released back to Millcreek staff. End of Report.
