Along the way, pt and her class were redirected about picking up pinecones, sticks, and more that were on the ground and also about throwing those items at one another. One of the pts peers accidentally hit pt in her left eye with a stick. Pt was shortly accessed by a nurse after class changes occurred. Furthermore, pt was scheduled and taken to her 4:30pm appointment at Urgent Care to have her eye further evaluated. Nursing Assessment 1 date/time: 02/26/24 4:15pm: Rec'd pt in rose mileu. Pt calm, cooperative to nurses assessment. Pt is alert and oriented to self/situation. Pt c/o a 'sharp pain' in L eye. Pt says that it feels like 'something is stabbing my eye'. Upon assessment, there is redness to the inner area of the L eye. No debris noted in eye. Appt w/ urgent care is set up for 2/26 at 1630 to assess for potential injury to eye. No further needs at this time. Nursing Assessment 2 date/time: 02/26/24 2:15pm: Client presented to the nurses station with staff and stated that she was accidently hit in the eye with a stick while outside. She had a visible red spot on her right cornea near the inner corner of her eye. Pt did not appear to be in acute distress. On visual examination there was no sign of any foreign object, however client endorsed pain with blinking. She denied any change in vision, no photophobia, she denied "feeling" like something was in her eye. No swelling, no drainage noted. Guardian was notified on 02/26/24 at 4:44pm
