When nurse was getting the client the PRN, client stuck her hand into the nurse
window grabbing a bottle of Ibuprofen. Client ran down the hallway and refused to give it to
staff, opening up the bottle and ingesting undisclosed amount. Client ran into the restroom
before staff could get it out of the clients mouth. Client had stated on Monday that she was
trying to find a way to go to Arkansas Children's Hospital. was called and MEM's was
ordered to come and transport client to Children's Hospital. Client returned back at the
RTC around 8pm. What we have done to change protocol on this, is make sure staff is
always present at the window when clients are asking for medicine. Nursing staff is to close
window if they move from the nurse window area, and we also have tapped off an area that
"items" should not be, so clients can not obtain. Client arrived at Children's for ingestion,
blood work was all normal, an EKG was done and normal, and and Oral Fluid Challenge
was completed.
Interim Action Narrative: Staff tried to get the medication from resident, the doctor was called, and MEMS transported resident to ACH.
Maltreatment Narrative:

Licensing Narrative: Program Coordinator reviewed provider reported incident for licensing concerns. Program Coordinator inquired if resident was on a safety plan after making as stated on Monday. Facility reported resident was already on suicidal precautions and remains on the precautions.
