Licensing Narrative: 5/6/2024- The provider reported incident was reviewed by the licensing specialist. Licensing Specialist contacted the facility in order to review the video footage of this incident. 5/8/2024 - Licensing Specialist received a response from the facility which stated you could not see the incident. Therefore the video was not saved. Information

regarding the incident can be discussed with facility staff. Licensing Specialist will follow up medical information from the follow up doctor's visit and assault precautions and supervision. 5/15/2024 - Licensing specialist received information from the facility regarding the incident. The residents were supervised by two staff for 12 residents in addition to the Certified Recreational Therapist and Activities Coordinator. On 5-8-24? Resident had

has a follow-up today at noon. Assault Precautions are precautionary measures implemented when a resident exhibits or threatens physical aggression towards another individual and/or property. The staff member assigned will maintain on Observation Flow Sheet documenting visual inspection of the resident, any activities the resident is engaged in, the location of the resident, the position the resident is sleeping (during night shift), at least every fifteen (15) minutes. The documentation is to occur at the time immediately following the visual check. The resident?s ability to attend school, off-site medical appointments, therapeutic activities, and have visitation will be determined on an individual basis by nursing, and/or therapist. Pre-cautions are assessed at least daily.
