Report Description: Incident Report for client in our PRTF program and resides in Rose House Incident Report date/time: 07/19/24 4:20pm Location: Rose House Incident Description: Medical Emergency (Trip to ER/Urgent Care) Staff Involved: Events Leading: Client was redirected several times by staff to stop doing flips in her area. Client then came into the milieu informing the nurse that she did a backbend and hit her head. Client was transported to Children's hospital by mems. Nursing Assessment date/time: 07/19/24 4:33pm: Nurse called to Rose house d/t report of pt 'hitting head on floor of room' after doing 'backbends'. Per house staff, pt was initially able to answer and respond to questions w/ inaccurate answers. When staff asked pt's age, pt stated Pt is currently nurses arrival at about 1630, pt is sitting in day area w/ neck hyperextended and head rested on back of chair with arms relaxed at sides and legs relaxed against chair. VS taken by LPN are as follows: BP 128/88, HR 100, RR 18, temp 98.1F. Resp are even, slightly labored, using abd muscles to support breathing. Pupils PERRLA w/ sluggish reaction to light. Pupils 4mm bilat. Pt has full ROM in all extremities. Unable to assess hand grip as pt is unable to follow nurses command. Speech is slurred. Pt is able to respond to nurse but is unable to answer questions. When asked 'Do you know what happened today?' Pt responds 'I don't know, I don't remember anything'. When asked about presence of h/a, dizziness, pt does not respond to nurses questions. Pt then began to call nurse 'mom' and asked if her mom was here. Attempted to orient pt, upon hearing that this RN is not her mother pt began to get further upset. Pt then began to move tongue around in mouth erratically and stick tongue out to L side of mouth. Pt facial muscles are twitching around eyes and mouth. Pt able to respond to gentle touches to hand/shoulder. Pt then became aphasic, words and sentences were not making sense. Occasionally, pt can answer 'yes' or 'no' or say the words 'mom' or 'dad'. No other words can be understood. Pt appears drowsy, attempts to fall

asleep while staff are talking to pt. Pt able to be woken w/ verbal stimuli and touch. Affect is tearful/anxious when this nurse and staff attempt to wake pt. Provider notified at 1633 upon initial assessment. MEMs called at 1640. Guardian was notified on 07/19/24 at 4:39pm. ER paperwork was emailed to on 07/22/24.
Interim Action Narrative: Resident was assessed by the nurse and transported to ACH via MEMS.
