On Saturday, November 9, 2024 at approximately 5:15 pm I, Officer Morris, was dispatched to the area of 211 Church St in reference to a runaway juvenile, S1. On scene, I began looking in a nearby wooded area with staff members of the Methodist Family Health (Dacus) Staff. S1 is a juvenile under the care of Dacus. We was unable to locate S1, so we went to the Dacus office to gather information regarding the situation. I spoke with Jessica Lassiter, a staff member, about the situation. Lassiter advised that S1 had gotten into a couple of altercations earlier in the day. She advised that she opened a door to bring in a tray of food and he ran out. She advised that she was able to grab him for a few seconds but was unable to stop him.

While gathering information, dispatch advised that S1 was at the old Kum&Go at the intersection on Hwy 63 B and East College St. I went to locate him. Deputy Ditto of the Craighead County Sheriff's Office arrived at Kum&Go moments before I did. I saw S1 through the front window of the store. We made contact with S1. He advised that he did not want to go back to Dacus and that he wanted to go to jail. Deputy Ditto stayed with S1 while I went outside and called the Juvenile Officer on call, Officer McDonald. Officer McDonald advised that I needed to take him back to Dacus because as of now he is a runaway Juvenile. He advised that I was allowed to place him in handcuff to do so, if S1 did not cooperate.

I went back inside and advised S1 that he had to go back to Dacus and that I was not going to take him to jail at this time. I asked S1, if he would go with me willingly. He advised that he would not. I told him to turn around and place his hands behind his back. He did so. I placed him in handcuffs and double locked them. Deputy Ditto and

I escorted him and placed him in the back passenger seat of my patrol vehicle. I transported him to Dacus. While waiting for the staff to meet us outside, S1 began thumping his head against the cage of my patrol until. He did not appear to be injuring himself so I did not interfere.

The staff met us out side and we escorted S1 to a room the staff had prepared for him. I turned over custody of S1 to the staff members and finished gathering information for a report.

Outside the facility, I cleared the call and was speaking to Deputy Ditto when dispatch advised over the radio that the staff had called back and advised they needed an officer. Lassiter came to the door and let us back inside. She advised that he was destroying his room. In the room, I saw S1 standing in the middle of the room with broken boards and a pillow with a door handle on it. The door handle had been broken off of the bedroom door. The boards was from the bunk bed in the room. I asked S1, what the problem was and he would not talk to me. I had him turn around and I placed him back in cuffs (double locked). S1 advised that he had a screw in his pocket, but he would not advise why. It was removed and we escorted him to the back seat of my patrol vehicle. I then called Officer McDonald with the Juvenile Department and advised him of the situation. Lassiter advised that she needed to call her boss to verify if the facility wanted to press charges. She advised that they wanted him taken to jail. I advised Officer McDonald what was said and he advised that I could take him to Craighead County Jail for Criminal Mischief.

At approximately 6:50 pm with the beginning miles of 85852, I began transporting S1 to the jail. At approximately 7:05 pm with an ending miles of 85861, we arrived at the jail. I turned over custody to the jailers at the detention center. At Officer McDonald's request, I advised the jailers that S1 should probably be screened for psychiatric issues due to the events of the night.

I cleared the jail and went back in service.
