**Report Description:** On 12/9/2024, client [REDACTED] (Residential) reported that she had eaten a peanut butter cracker and was having an allergic. She received 50mg of Benadryl at Centers but continued to complain of an itchy throat. Out of an abundance of caution, she was transported to ACH for further evaluation. ACH did not administer additional medication, diagnosed her with [REDACTED] and recommended adding Zyrtec to her medications.
