Assist Ambulance

On April 20, 2025, at approximately 1949 hours, I, Deputy Escamilla, responded to 20400 Colonel Glenn Rd Little Rock, AR 72210, in reference to a female being aggressive toward staff members at the Crestview House.

Upon arrival, I made contact with Amanda Fields, who advised that [redacted] wanted to shower and requested a razor. However, per Youth Home policy when there is a Tornado Warning or Tornado Watch they are not allowed to shower in case they need to take cover in the showers. [redacted] was upset that [redacted] was not allowed to shower or use a razor, so [redacted] left Crestview House and Amanda followed [redacted] in the van. [redacted] grabbed a long stick and tried to poke Mrs. Z. but made no contact with her. They were able to calm [redacted] and get [redacted] back in the house with small restraints. [redacted] started making threats toward Mrs. Z and did not wish to speak or see her. Amanda was able to calm [redacted] down. Prior to my arrival, Mrs. Z was no longer on scene.

I observed [redacted] sitting down in a chair, no longer in restraints and calm. Amanda told [redacted] that M.E.M.S. would be transporting [redacted] to Children's Hospital and they were concerned for [redacted] safety. [redacted] asked if [redacted] would be able to come back and Amanda told [redacted] that she knew [redacted] wants to get better, and would come back to the Youth Home.

M.E.M.S. Unit 12 arrived on scene and transported [redacted] without issues. I advised Amanda that I would be making a report concerning the incident.
