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## Narrative:

The Licensing Specialist visited the facility with

to follow up on complaint case 028267.

The facility census is currently 158 PRTF residents.

All incident reports and restraint documents maintained by the facility between 3/6/2025 and 3/12/2025 for the A/V were received from the facility by the Licensing Specialist.

Due to the alleged incident occurring during school (3/12/2025), and no video footage being available, two residents who were also in the classroom on that day were interviewed.

**Resident 1:**Resident reports that they saw the incident that took place. The resident reports that the A/V wanted to leave the class and was not permitted to by the facility staff. The A/V then knocked over a Christmas tree, threw things, hit staff with a box, and was trying to spit on the staff. The resident reports that they did not witness staff kick, punch, scratch, or push A/V's head down or put their arm on A/V's neck.

**Resident 2:**Resident reports that they saw the incident that took place. The resident reports that they did not see staff kick, push the A/V's head down, scratch, or choke the A/V during the restraint hold.

## Licensing complaint 028267 is UNFOUNDED for violations of Minimum Licensing Standards

• 109.1.gUnprofessional conduct in the practice of child welfare activities shall include without limitation: (g) Engaging in behavior that could be viewed as sexual, dangerous, exploitative, or physically harmful to children.

• 905.4.gThe following disciplinary actions shall not be used: (g) Physical injury or threat of bodily harm;

• 905.9Physical restraints shall be performed using minimal force and time necessary. Physical restraint means the application of physical force without the use of any device, for the purpose of restraining the free movement of a resident's body. Briefly holding a child without undue force in order to calm or comfort them or holding a hand to safely escort a child from one area to another, is not considered a physical restraint.

\*\*\*\*\* Pursuant to A.C.A. § 9-24-406(e)(3-4): If you believe that the Department's notice of noncompliance is in error, you may ask for reconsideration. The request for reconsideration must be in writing and delivered to the Department by certified mail within twenty (20) business days of receipt of the notice of noncompliance. The request must specify the parts of the notice that are alleged to be in error, explain why you believe those parts are in error, and include documentation to support the allegation of error. Once received the Department shall issue a decision on your request within twenty (20) days after receipt of the request.
